Paul, a Green Police & Crime Commissioner for Staffordshire, your first choice

Paul has been motivated to stand as the Green Party candidate across Staffordshire to stand for the position of Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) to be elected in May as a result of his work on the Safer Neighbourhood Panel and having listened to Hednesford residents' concerns on the doorstep. Paul wishes to use the platform of being a candidate to make sure Hednesford's voice is

heard loud and clear. The PCC is elected to hold the County police service to account and work with communities to determine priorities. The Green Party has a distinctive voice on crime, justice and policing with a focus on community policing and addressing the causes of crime rather than coping with the symptoms. The voting system for this role is different from the district council with


a single transferable vote that allows you to vote for your favoured Green candidate as first choice and transfer to the less desirable main parties if an alternative is needed.

Paul has been leading a campaign to highlight the community opposition to this happening under the Chase and has gained the support of over 3000 residents to send a strong message to the council for a Frack-Free Staffordshire and to promote a sustainable renewable energy industry.
