I will continue to be active, visible and available. There is great deal of work ahead to address concerns already raised as well as those which will develop in the weeks, months and years to come. I am here to help and will keep in touch through my quarterly newsletter Chase Issues

Whilst the next few weeks are busy with an induction programme arranged by the Council I will still be out and about working on the Community Speedwatch to source and apply for funding as well as the concerns raised about litter, green spaces and potholes. As well as a number of concerns raised by individuals the time ahead will be interesting, varied and busy.

It will take me a while, if at all, to get used to being called Councillor but be assured my first priority remains Hednesford and the campaigning on issues which are our collective priorities for a better, stronger community.

Again thank you for your support and the privilege of meeting so many fantastic people over the last few weeks. Whether we have had the chance to meet yet or not, if have questions for me, please do contact me by email, phone or catch me in the street.

We achieved 618 votes with conservative and labour trailing in 2nd and 3rd respectively with 320 and 298 votes whilst UKIP polled 213 votes with, collectively the highest turnout in the District at 35.67%

Paul, members of Cannock Chase Green Party and local residents met Natalie on her visit to Hednesford. First stop was at Kingsmead School where Natalie answered a range of questions from sixth form and year 11 students covering topics from nuclear weapons to funding of free university places and animal rights to energy policy.

Community Speedwatch Progressing

Paul has been out with volunteers delivering wheelie bin stickers to remind motorists of the speed limit along the streets requested by neighbours. If we did not catch you in please drop Paul a call or an email and we will get them distributed to you directly.

Paul continues his efforts to raise the £1000 needed to fund the equipment and training for the volunteers who want to establish the formal Community Speedwatch. This takes a little time however progress is being made with several avenues and hope to have some good news soon.

Paul was joined by expert speakers from across politics and across the globe to highlight the dangers of fracking and the imminent threat to parts of North Staffordshire and the potential threat to Cannock Chase owing to the Conservative government imposed change to law that allows fracking under Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The delegates were informed on subjects from the environmental and financial damage to the distinctive characteristics of our countryside as well as a guest from Australia who talked about similar campaigns down under. Thank you to every who attended and if you want to know more drop Paul a line.

Staffordshire

Following our victory to prevent the sale of our Countryside the process continues to explore the management options of each individual green space across the county. In particular Cannock Chase and Chasewater will be referred back to the scrutiny committee before decisions are made.
